All new buildings or new exterior additions including sheds or garages must first be approved by the Town of Middletown before applying for a Building Permit with Frederick County. Information and details such as location of existing structures and distances from the front, sides and rear yard will be necessary.

Town Code section 3-8

No person shall allow feces deposited by his/her animal to remain on any public highway, street, sidewalk, part of other public property, or on private property without written consent of the owner thereof or his agent.

Penalty – Any person who knowingly violates this Ordinance shall be guilty of a littering infraction and shall be subject to a fine of not more than \$25.00 per occurrence

If you notice a street light out please contact the Public Works Department at 540-869-7731. Please provide the following information. Your name, your phone number, the street light address and the pole number if possible. We will then contact Rappahannock Electric regarding the outage.

**Please note that the last day of yard waste pick up will be Monday November 21, 2016 **

Please take time to review the guidelines. We will no longer pick up any yard waste that does not meet the required guidelines. Yard waste collection will be every Monday, and must be placed curbside by 7:30 a.m. Yard waste consists of grass trimmings and leaves which CANNOT weigh more than 40 lbs. Branches or twigs can be NO LONGER than four (4) feet in length and NO LARGER than two (2) inches in diameter (per branch or twig) and must be tied in bundles (no wire or plastic string). Yard waste must be placed in biodegradable or paper yard waste bags only NO PLASTIC BAGS. Yard waste should not be placed curbside until the morning of collection. Yard waste will not be picked up if bag(s) tear because they have been curbside for days and become rain soaked or wet. Thank you for your continued cooperation.

- Effective January 1, 2016 there is a 3% convenience fee for all debit and credit card payments.
- The Town of Middletown accepts Visa, MasterCard, and Discover.
- If the Town office receives 3 returned checks from an individual, all further transactions must be paid by debit or credit card, money order, or cash. The return check fee is \$45.00
- The Town cannot accept large amounts of unrolled change. If you must pay in change it has to be rolled in coin wrappers.
- Middletown Residents, if you are having contracted work done at your home such as roofing, plumbing, building additions, these are just to name a few; the contractor(s) must obtain a Business License from the Town of Middletown.

Just a reminder to all Middletown residents, please update your contact information with the Town office. Telephone numbers are very important to the Town staff in case we need to contact you in the event of an emergency. If you have already updated your information thank you for helping keep our records current.

When you buy, trade, sell or dispose of a vehicle you must notify Frederick County 540-665-5681 extension 1. The Town of Middletown <u>receives all billing information</u> from Frederick County therefore they must have the correct information on file in order for the Town of Middletown to bill you correctly.

All utility payments are due by the due date indicated and, if late, penalties will be applied. If the bill is not paid in full by the cut-off date, service will be disconnected for non-payment and there will be a \$100.00 cut-off/on fee added to your bill. Only those individuals with bona fide emergencies will be considered on a case-by-case basis for a ONE-TIME deferment. There will be no payment arrangements.
