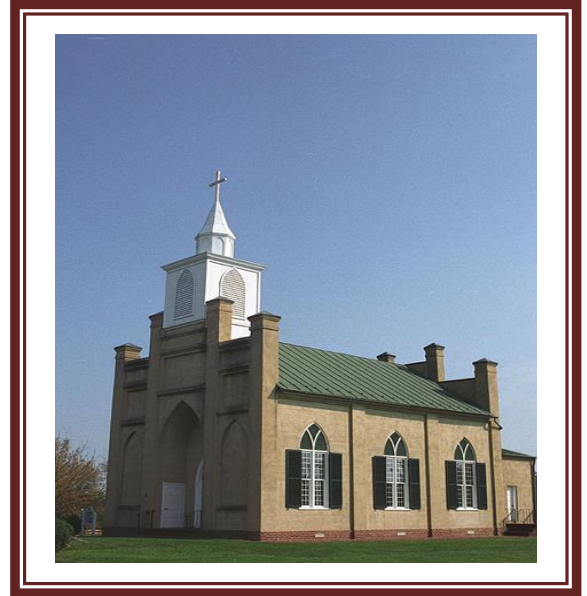


# Historic St. Thomas Chapel

Middletown, Virginia

St. Thomas Chapel is patterned after the York Cathedral in England and has been of architectural importance and historic interest in the Town of Middletown, Virginia since 1836. It began as an Episcopal Church and now is used for inter-faith services, weddings, and special events of religious and cultural interest. Being in the midst of battlegrounds of the Civil War, it suffered major damage when used as a hospital for wounded soldiers and a stable for cavalry horses. Beginning in 1967 and continuing to the present, the Chapel has been under the guidance of a Board of Trustees to restore and preserve this treasured site. In 1973 the St. Thomas Chapel was registered as a Virginia Landmark, and named to the National Register of Historic Places.
